Notes for students:

- **P1 exams start at 09:00** - you need to be on the Noble St. car park for 8.50 prompt. Register in your form room as normal but once registered your tutor will let you go immediately to the Sixth Form car park – do not wait for the end of registration.
- **P3 exams start at 11.30** - you must be on the Sixth Form car park for 11.20 - make your way to Noble St. at the start of break.
- Please **bring your books and equipment** for 'normal' lessons during periods 2, 4 and 5 each day.
- For all exams, you must **meet on the Sixth Form car park** in good time. You will **line up in form groups**, in alphabetical order behind a plastic cone and await instructions. **Once you are asked to be quiet you will do so immediately.**
- We have the **highest expectations of behaviour** in all examinations – no communicating once inside the hall until you leave the building and you must raise your hand if you require assistance. If are reported by an invigilator because your behaviour falls below expectation you will receive a full detention and a letter home. If this happens a second time you will receive an after-school detention. Please ensure that your behaviour is perfect throughout the examination period.
- **Exams will take place in the Stanier Hall or D4.** If you are entitled to **extra time then your exams will take place in D2/3/4.**
- **Bring all necessary equipment** for the exams in a clear plastic bag/clear pencil case. This includes, pens, pencils, rulers, calculators and erasers. You should write in **BLACK** ink. A calculator will be provided for maths and science exams **ONLY**.
- **Water bottles** should be in a clear bottle. **No food** is permitted in the examination halls.
- **Toilet facilities** – please use the Stanier Hall toilets **ONLY** (Cadet Hut side). **Do not enter the Ruscoe/Lamont Centre.**
- Revision in preparation for your exams should be taken seriously. Your subject teachers will give you some direction on what to revise and how to revise. Learning how to revise properly/effectively will have a hugely positive effect for your future. Take the time to find out what works best. Different things work for different people – what are your preferred methods?
- If you have any questions regarding the timetable then see Mr Winter. Any subject questions should be taken to your teacher.
