Following the awful death of Sarah Everard there has been a lot of debate about how we raise awareness of sexual harassment, violence towards women, personal safety and how we can best support young people to feel and be safe.

PSHE is key to helping young people understand boundaries, healthy relationships and consent. It gives educators and students a safe and structured place to explore these important issues. It is important that as parents/carers that you feel equipped to discuss this with your child.
